OUR COMMITMENT

At Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre, every child has the right to feel safe, respected, included and empowered.

We are committed to providing a child-safe environment where children's rights, wellbeing and voices are central to every decision, interaction and experience.

We actively promote a culture where children are protected from abuse, neglect, harm, discrimination and bullying. We recognise that child safety is everyone's responsibility and is embedded within our leadership, governance, educational program, recruitment practices, professional learning and partnerships with families.

We value children as capable, confident individuals and are committed to listening to them, respecting their views and ensuring they are supported to participate in decisions that affect their lives.

LEGISLATIVE INTENT

This policy supports Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre in meeting its obligations under the Education and Care Services National Law and Regulations, the Victorian Child Safe Standards, the Child Wellbeing and Safety Act 2005 (Vic), and other relevant legislation while promoting children's safety, wellbeing, participation and cultural safety.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to ensure Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre provides a safe, inclusive and child-focused environment where children's rights are upheld and risks of harm are prevented, identified and responded to promptly and appropriately.

This policy establishes a clear framework for creating and maintaining a culture of child safety through leadership, governance, professional practice, continuous improvement and strong partnerships with families and the community.

DEFINITIONS

Child Safety

Actions taken to protect children from abuse, neglect, harm, discrimination and exploitation while promoting their wellbeing and rights.

Child Abuse

Includes physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional or psychological abuse, neglect, family violence and grooming behaviours.

Child Safe Culture

A culture where child safety is embedded in leadership, governance, daily practice and decision-making, and where children are respected, heard and protected.

Cultural Safety

An environment where children feel safe to express their identity, culture, language, beliefs and traditions without fear of discrimination or exclusion.

Mandatory Reporter

A person who is legally required to report a reasonable belief that a child is in need of protection from physical or sexual abuse.

Reportable Conduct

Conduct that causes harm to a child or places a child at risk of harm, as defined under the Victorian Reportable Conduct Scheme.

WHY THIS POLICY MATTERS

Children thrive when they feel physically and emotionally safe, respected and connected. Creating a child-safe environment requires more than compliance with legislation.

It requires strong leadership, reflective practice, respectful relationships and a shared commitment to protecting children from harm.

At Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre, child safety is embedded in every aspect of our service and is continuously strengthened through collaboration with children, families, educators and the wider community.

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre believes:

- Every child has the right to be safe.
- Children's voices are valued and influence decisions.
- Families are respected as children's first teachers.
- Diversity is celebrated.
- Cultural safety is essential.
- Child safety is everyone's responsibility.
- Concerns are taken seriously and responded to promptly.
- Professional learning strengthens child-safe practice.
- Continuous reflection improves outcomes for children.

OUR POLICY

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre is committed to embedding child safety into every aspect of service delivery.

We maintain a zero-tolerance approach to child abuse and are committed to creating an environment where children are protected from physical, emotional, sexual and psychological harm, neglect, discrimination, racism and bullying.

All educators, leaders, students, volunteers and contractors are expected to uphold the rights of children, act professionally, comply with the Child Safe Code of Conduct and respond immediately to any concern regarding a child's safety or wellbeing.

The service promotes child participation, cultural safety and respectful relationships while maintaining clear reporting processes and strong governance to ensure children's safety remains the highest priority.

HOW WE PUT THIS POLICY INTO PRACTICE

Building a Child-Safe Culture

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre will:

- Embed child safety into all aspects of governance, leadership and daily practice.
- Promote a culture where every child feels safe, respected, valued and included.
- Ensure all decisions are made in the best interests of children.
- Foster positive, respectful and responsive relationships between children and educators.
- Encourage children to express their views and participate in decisions that affect them.
- Promote equity, inclusion and respect for diversity.

Empowering Children

The service will:

- Support children to understand their rights.
- Encourage children to express their thoughts, feelings and concerns.
- Provide opportunities for children to contribute to decisions about their learning and environment.
- Teach children about personal safety, protective behaviours and seeking help from trusted adults through age-appropriate experiences.
- Ensure children's voices are genuinely considered during planning, reflection and continuous improvement.

Partnerships with Families

The service will:

- Recognise families as children's first and most influential teachers.
- Work collaboratively with families to support children's safety and wellbeing.
- Provide families with information regarding child safety, child protection and the Victorian Child Safe Standards.
- Encourage families to raise concerns, provide feedback and participate in service improvement.
- Respect family diversity, culture, language and individual circumstances.

Safe Recruitment and Screening

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre will ensure:

- All educators, volunteers and students undergo appropriate recruitment and screening processes.
- Working with Children Checks, VIT registration and other legislative requirements are verified before commencement.
- Reference checks are completed.
- Child safety responsibilities are discussed during recruitment.
- All new team members complete a comprehensive induction before working with children.

Professional Learning

The service will:

- Provide ongoing child safety and child protection training.
- Ensure educators understand their mandatory reporting obligations.
- Review child-safe practices during staff meetings and professional discussions.
- Encourage critical reflection on interactions, supervision and child safety practices.
- Maintain records of all professional learning.

Supervision and Risk Management

Educators will:

- Maintain active supervision at all times.
 - Conduct daily safety checks of indoor and outdoor environments.
 - Identify and minimise potential risks to children's safety.
 - Complete risk assessments where required.
 - Follow supervision plans and service procedures.
 - Respond immediately to hazards or concerns.
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Responding to Concerns

All concerns regarding a child's safety or wellbeing will be:

- Taken seriously.
 - Responded to immediately.
 - Documented accurately.
 - Reported in accordance with legislative requirements and service procedures.
 - Managed confidentially.
 - Reviewed to identify opportunities for continuous improvement.
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Visitors, Volunteers and Contractors

The service will ensure:

- Visitors sign in and out.
 - Visitors are supervised where appropriate.
 - Volunteers and students understand the Child Safe Code of Conduct.
 - Contractors comply with child-safe requirements while on site.
 - Children are never placed at risk through unsupervised access.
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Online Safety

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre will:

- Protect children's privacy when using digital technologies.
 - Obtain family authorisation for photographs and media.
 - Use digital platforms responsibly.
 - Ensure children's information remains confidential.
 - Educate children about safe and respectful use of technology where appropriate.
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ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES

Approved Provider

Will:

- Promote a culture of child safety.
 - Ensure compliance with legislation.
 - Provide adequate resources.
 - Monitor implementation of this policy.
 - Review governance systems regularly.
 - Ensure child safety remains a standing agenda item during governance reviews.
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Centre Director

Will:

- Lead a positive child-safe culture.
 - Ensure all concerns are managed appropriately.
 - Support educators to meet their child protection responsibilities.
 - Monitor compliance with the Victorian Child Safe Standards.
 - Facilitate ongoing professional learning.
 - Review incidents and identify continuous improvement opportunities.
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Educational Leader

Will:

- Support educators to embed child-safe practices into the educational program.
 - Promote reflective practice.
 - Encourage children's participation.
 - Monitor interactions between educators and children.
 - Support inclusion and cultural safety.
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Educators

Will:

- Uphold the Child Safe Code of Conduct.
 - Maintain professional boundaries.
 - Actively supervise children.
 - Listen to children's voices.
 - Respond to concerns immediately.
 - Complete mandatory reporting where required.
 - Participate in professional learning.
 - Model respectful behaviour.
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Administration Team

Will:

- Maintain confidential records.
 - Support child-safe recruitment processes.
 - Ensure required documentation is current.
 - Provide child safety information to families during enrolment.
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Families

Will:

- Work collaboratively with educators.
- Share information relevant to their child's safety and wellbeing.
- Raise concerns respectfully.
- Support the service's child-safe practices.

KIDS ON GALLAGHERS IN PRACTICE

At Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre, child safety is embedded in everyday practice rather than treated as a separate compliance requirement.

Children are encouraged to express their ideas, emotions and concerns through meaningful conversations, visual communication tools, meetings with educators and child-led decision-making. Educators intentionally build trusting relationships that support children to feel secure, confident and valued.

Our leadership team regularly reviews environments, supervision practices, educator interactions and family feedback to ensure child safety remains central to continuous improvement. Child-safe practices are discussed during staff meetings, professional development and critical reflection to ensure they remain current, responsive and meaningful.

CHILDREN'S VOICE IN ACTION

Children are active participants in creating a safe, inclusive and respectful environment at Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre. Educators intentionally create opportunities for children to express their ideas, preferences and concerns through conversations, group discussions, visual communication tools, play experiences and daily routines.

Children are supported to understand their rights, identify trusted adults and develop confidence to speak up when they feel unsafe or uncomfortable. Their feedback influences decisions about the learning environment, routines, rules and experiences, reinforcing that every child's voice is valued, respected and acted upon.

EXCEEDING PRACTICE

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre goes beyond compliance by embedding child safety into every aspect of governance, leadership and educational practice.

Children's voices directly influence service decisions, family partnerships are authentic and respectful, and educators engage in ongoing professional learning and critical reflection to strengthen child-safe practices.

Leadership regularly reviews policies, observations, incident trends, educator practice and family feedback to identify opportunities for improvement. Rather than viewing child safety as a standalone policy, it is embedded across every aspect of service delivery and organisational culture.

CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre is committed to continuously strengthening our child-safe culture through ongoing reflection, evaluation and improvement.

This policy will be reviewed through:

- Changes to legislation, regulations and best practice guidance.
- Updates to the Victorian Child Safe Standards.
- ACECQA guidance and Assessment and Rating outcomes.
- Educator, child and family feedback.
- Internal audits and governance reviews.
- Child safety incidents and near misses.
- Complaints, compliments and service feedback.
- Professional learning and staff discussions.
- Critical reflection and the Quality Improvement Plan.
- Annual policy review.

Continuous improvement ensures our practices remain current, responsive and focused on achieving the best outcomes for children.

- How have we strengthened our child-safe culture since the last policy review?
