OUR COMMITMENT

At Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre, we are committed to providing a safe, inclusive and supportive environment where every child with a diagnosed medical condition can fully participate in all aspects of the educational program.

We recognise that effective management of medical conditions relies on strong partnerships with families, clear communication, well-trained educators and individualised planning. Our educators are committed to responding promptly and appropriately to children's health needs while maintaining each child's dignity, wellbeing and inclusion.

Through proactive planning, regular training and ongoing risk assessment, we strive to minimise health risks and ensure all children receive the care and support they require.

LEGISLATIVE INTENT

This policy supports Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre in meeting its obligations under the Education and Care Services National Law and National Regulations by ensuring appropriate procedures are in place to manage children's diagnosed medical conditions, reduce health risks and respond effectively in the event of a medical emergency.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to ensure consistent procedures are in place for the safe management of children's diagnosed medical conditions, including allergies, anaphylaxis, asthma, diabetes and other health conditions that require ongoing management.

This policy outlines how the service works in partnership with families to develop individual medical management strategies, minimise risks and ensure educators are prepared to respond appropriately to medical emergencies.

DEFINITIONS

Medical Condition

A diagnosed health condition that requires ongoing management, monitoring or treatment while a child attends the service.

Medical Management Plan

A written plan completed by a registered medical practitioner that outlines the child's diagnosed condition, required treatment, medication and emergency response procedures.

Risk Minimisation Plan

An individual plan developed in consultation with the child's family to identify potential risks and the strategies required to minimise those risks while the child attends the service.

Medical Emergency

A situation where a child's health rapidly deteriorates or requires immediate medical attention, including the administration of prescribed emergency medication and, where necessary, contacting emergency services.

WHY THIS POLICY MATTERS

Every child has the right to participate safely, confidently and inclusively in education and care, regardless of their health needs.

Effective management of medical conditions protects children's health, reduces the likelihood of medical emergencies and provides reassurance to families that appropriate systems are in place. Through careful planning, educator training and strong partnerships with families, children with medical conditions are supported to fully participate in all experiences while maintaining their safety, dignity and wellbeing.

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre is committed to:

- Supporting the safe inclusion of every child with a diagnosed medical condition.
- Working in partnership with families and health professionals.
- Maintaining current medical management plans and risk minimisation plans.
- Ensuring educators receive appropriate training relevant to children's medical needs.
- Providing timely and appropriate responses to medical emergencies.
- Maintaining confidentiality while ensuring essential health information is accessible to relevant educators.
- Reviewing medical information regularly to ensure it remains current.
- Promoting children's health, wellbeing and full participation in the educational program.

OUR POLICY

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre is committed to ensuring all children with diagnosed medical conditions are supported through individualised planning, effective communication and safe practices that promote their health, wellbeing and inclusion.

Before a child with a diagnosed medical condition commences at the service, families must provide a current medical management plan completed by a registered medical practitioner, along with any prescribed medication and required authorisations. In consultation with the family, the service will develop a risk minimisation plan and communication plan to ensure all relevant educators understand their responsibilities.

Educators will follow each child's medical management plan, maintain appropriate supervision, minimise identified risks and respond promptly to any signs of illness or medical emergency. Prescribed medication will be readily accessible, stored appropriately and administered in accordance with the child's medical management plan and the service's Medication Administration Policy.

The service will regularly review medical information with families and ensure educators maintain the knowledge and confidence required to safely support children with diagnosed medical conditions.

HOW WE PUT THIS POLICY INTO PRACTICE

Enrolment and Medical Information

Before a child with a diagnosed medical condition commences at Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre, families must provide:

- A current Medical Management Plan completed and signed by a registered medical practitioner.
- All prescribed medication required by the child while attending the service.
- Written authorisation for the administration of medication.
- Current emergency contact details.
- Relevant information about the child's triggers, symptoms and individual care needs.

Children will not commence care until all required documentation and medication have been received, unless alternative arrangements have been agreed to in accordance with legislative requirements.

Individual Risk Minimisation Plans

For every child with a diagnosed medical condition, the service will develop an Individual Risk Minimisation Plan in consultation with the family.

The plan will identify:

- Known triggers or risk factors.
- Strategies to minimise risks throughout the day.
- Mealtime procedures where applicable.
- Procedures during excursions, special events and outdoor play.
- Storage and accessibility of medication.
- Responsibilities of educators.
- Emergency response procedures.

Risk minimisation plans will be reviewed whenever the child's medical needs change and at least annually.

Communication Plans

A communication plan will be developed for each child with a diagnosed medical condition to ensure all relevant people understand their responsibilities.

This includes communication with:

- Families.
- Educators.
- Relief educators.
- Students and volunteers (where appropriate).
- The Approved Provider.
- Relevant health professionals where authorised by the family.

Families will be informed whenever there are changes to the child's medical management arrangements.

Medication Management

Educators will:

- Store prescribed medication safely while ensuring it remains readily accessible during an emergency.
- Check medication expiry dates regularly.
- Ensure medication is clearly labelled with the child's name and dosage instructions.
- Administer medication only with appropriate authorisation, except where legislation permits emergency administration.
- Record all medication administered in accordance with service procedures.

- Return medication to its designated storage location immediately after use.
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Educator Training

- Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre will ensure educators receive appropriate training relevant to children's medical conditions.
 - Training may include:
 - Anaphylaxis management.
 - Asthma management.
 - Diabetes awareness.
 - Administration of emergency medication.
 - First Aid, CPR and emergency response procedures.
 - Individual training relating to children's specific medical needs where required.
 - Professional learning will be reviewed regularly to ensure educators maintain current knowledge and confidence.
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Responding to Medical Emergencies

If a child experiences a medical emergency, educators will:

- Follow the child's Medical Management Plan.
 - Administer prescribed emergency medication where required.
 - Contact emergency services (000) immediately when appropriate.
 - Continue to monitor and reassure the child until emergency assistance arrives.
 - Notify the child's family as soon as practicable.
 - Complete all required incident documentation.
 - Review procedures following the incident to identify opportunities for improvement.
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Confidentiality

Medical information will be treated respectfully and confidentially.

Information will only be shared with educators and relevant personnel who require the information to safely care for the child while ensuring children's privacy and dignity are maintained.

Inclusion

Children with diagnosed medical conditions will be supported to participate fully in all aspects of the educational program.

Educators will adapt environments, routines and experiences where necessary to reduce identified risks while ensuring children remain active participants in learning alongside their peers.

ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES

Approved Providers

Will:

- Ensure systems are in place to effectively manage children's medical conditions.
 - Provide appropriate resources and emergency medication storage.
 - Support educator training and compliance with legislative requirements.
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Centre Director

Will:

- Ensure all required medical documentation is current before a child commences.
- Develop Individual Risk Minimisation Plans and Communication Plans in partnership with families.
- Monitor compliance with this policy.
- Ensure educators receive appropriate training.
- Review medical incidents to strengthen service practices.

Educational Leader

Will:

- Support educators to embed inclusive practices for children with medical conditions.
- Encourage reflective practice regarding children's health, wellbeing and participation.
- Promote collaborative planning that supports every child's inclusion.

Educators

Will:

- Follow each child's Medical Management Plan and Risk Minimisation Plan.
- Maintain current knowledge of children's diagnosed medical conditions.
- Administer medication in accordance with service procedures and legislative requirements.
- Monitor children for signs of illness or medical distress.
- Respond promptly to medical emergencies.
- Communicate respectfully with families regarding children's health needs.
- Maintain confidentiality while ensuring children's safety.

Students, Volunteers and Relief Educators

Will:

- Work under the guidance of qualified educators.
- Familiarise themselves with relevant medical procedures appropriate to their role.
- Immediately report concerns regarding a child's health.
- Never administer medication unless authorised and appropriately trained to do so.

KIDS ON GALLAGHERS IN PRACTICE

At Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre, we believe every child deserves to feel safe, included and supported, regardless of their medical needs. We work closely with families from enrolment onwards to develop individual plans that enable children with medical conditions to confidently participate in all aspects of our program.

Educators regularly review children's medical information; participate in professional learning and practise emergency response procedures to ensure they remain confident and prepared. Medical management is embedded into everyday practice rather than viewed as a separate responsibility.

Through thoughtful planning, open communication and inclusive practices, we minimise risks while ensuring children continue to explore, learn and build relationships alongside their peers

CHILDREN'S VOICE IN ACTION

Children are supported to develop an age-appropriate understanding of their own health, wellbeing and safety.

Where appropriate, educators encourage children to recognise their own needs, communicate when they are feeling unwell and participate in routines that support their health. Children's confidence, independence and dignity are promoted while ensuring their individual medical needs remain safely supported.

EXCEEDING PRACTICE

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre views the management of medical conditions as a shared responsibility that extends beyond legislative compliance.

Educators engage in ongoing professional learning, regularly review individual plans with families and critically reflect on practice to ensure support strategies remain responsive and effective. Emergency procedures are discussed, practised and evaluated to build educator confidence and readiness.

Strong partnerships with families and a proactive approach to risk management enable children with medical conditions to fully participate in our educational program while experiencing a genuine sense of belonging, inclusion and wellbeing.

CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre is committed to continually strengthening our management of children's medical conditions.

This policy will be reviewed through:

- Feedback from children, families and educators.
- Reviews of Individual Medical Management Plans and Risk Minimisation Plans.
- Incident and medical emergency reviews.
- Professional learning and training updates.
- Staff meetings and critical reflection.
- Quality Improvement Plan goals.
- Changes to legislation and recognised best practice.

Continuous improvement ensures our procedures remain current, responsive and effective in supporting the health, safety and inclusion of every child.

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre demonstrates this policy through:

REFLECTION & CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT

Critical reflection supports our commitment to providing safe, responsive and inclusive care for children with diagnosed medical conditions.

Reflective questions include:

- How effectively do our systems support children with medical conditions to participate safely and confidently in the program?
- Are Medical Management Plans, Risk Minimisation Plans and Communication Plans current and consistently implemented?
- Do educators feel confident in recognising and responding to medical emergencies?
- How effectively do we work in partnership with families to support children's health needs?
- How do we minimise risks while maintaining children's inclusion, dignity and independence?
- What have we learnt through medical incidents, family feedback and critical reflection?

- What opportunities exist to further strengthen our medical management practices?
- Outcomes from these reflections inform policy reviews, professional learning, risk management strategies and our Quality Improvement Plan.
