OUR COMMITMENT

At **Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre**, the safety, wellbeing and protection of every child is our highest priority.

We are committed to providing active supervision at all times to ensure children are protected from harm while encouraging independence, exploration and learning. Educators intentionally position themselves, monitor children's movements and assess risks within both indoor and outdoor environments to create safe and engaging learning experiences.

Effective supervision is embedded into every aspect of our daily practice and is supported through teamwork, communication, professional judgement and ongoing risk assessment.

LEGISLATIVE INTENT

This policy supports Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre in meeting its obligations under the Education and Care Services National Law and National Regulations by ensuring children are adequately supervised at all times to minimise risks, protect their safety and support their wellbeing.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to provide clear expectations for active supervision throughout the service.

This policy aims to ensure educators consistently implement supervision practices that protect children from harm, respond to changing environments and support children's learning, development and wellbeing.

DEFINITIONS

Active Supervision

A continuous process where educators intentionally observe, position themselves, listen, anticipate risks and respond immediately to ensure children's safety while supporting their learning and independence.

Risk Assessment

The ongoing process of identifying potential hazards, assessing the level of risk and implementing strategies to minimise or eliminate those risks.

Line of Sight

Maintaining a position where educators can see and effectively monitor children and respond immediately when required.

WHY THIS POLICY MATTERS

Children learn best when they feel safe, secure and supported to explore their environment.

Effective supervision protects children from harm while allowing them to participate confidently in play, learning and daily routines. It enables educators to anticipate risks, respond quickly to changing situations and provide appropriate support based on each child's age, abilities and individual needs.

Consistent supervision practices also strengthen children's wellbeing, promote positive relationships and provide reassurance for families that their children are cared for in a safe and responsive environment.

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre is committed to:

- Maintaining active supervision at all times.
- Protecting children from harm and hazards.
- Supporting children's independence while managing risk appropriately.
- Ensuring educators remain aware of children's whereabouts.
- Maintaining effective communication between team members.
- Regularly assessing environments for potential hazards.
- Promoting a shared responsibility for children's safety.
- Embedding supervision into every aspect of daily practice.

OUR POLICY

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre is committed to ensuring all children are actively supervised at all times during education and care, including indoor and outdoor play, routines, transitions, excursions and emergency situations.

Educators will use active supervision strategies that include intentional positioning, regular head counts, effective communication, ongoing risk assessment and continuous observation of children's engagement and wellbeing. Supervision practices will be responsive to the changing needs of children, the environment and daily routines.

Children will be supported to explore, investigate and develop independence within environments that are thoughtfully planned, closely monitored and regularly reviewed to minimise risks while promoting learning opportunities.

HOW WE PUT THIS POLICY INTO PRACTICE

Active Supervision

Educators at Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre will:

- Maintain active supervision of children at all times.
- Position themselves to maximise visibility of all children and learning environments.
- Regularly scan the environment and anticipate potential risks.
- Listen carefully to children's conversations and play.
- Move throughout the environment rather than remaining in one location.
- Ensure every child is accounted for throughout the day.

Indoor and Outdoor Environments

The service will:

- Arrange learning environments to support clear lines of sight wherever possible.
- Regularly inspect indoor and outdoor areas for potential hazards.
- Position educators according to children's ages, abilities, interests and activities.
- Adjust supervision levels when higher-risk experiences are offered.
- Ensure gates, doors and entry points remain secure.
- Monitor areas that may present reduced visibility or increased risk.

Supervision During Routines and Transitions

Educators will:

- Maintain active supervision during toileting, nappy changing and handwashing routines while respecting each child's privacy and dignity.
- Closely supervise meal and snack times.
- Ensure children are supervised during rest and sleep periods in accordance with the Sleep and Rest Policy.
- Maintain supervision during arrivals, departures and transitions between indoor and outdoor environments.
- Conduct regular head counts during transitions and throughout the day.
- Communicate clearly with other educators during staff changes and routine transitions.

Excursions and Regular Outings

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre will:

- Conduct risk assessments before excursions and regular outings.
- Maintain educator-to-child ratios at all times.
- Allocate supervision responsibilities before leaving the service.

- Conduct head counts before departure, during the outing and upon returning.
- Ensure children remain within sight or hearing of educators at all times.

Managing Risks

Educators will:

- Continuously assess the environment for hazards.
- Remove or minimise identified risks immediately where possible.
- Report maintenance or safety concerns promptly.
- Adapt supervision strategies to changing weather conditions, group dynamics and children's needs.
- Respond immediately to incidents or emerging risks.

Team Communication

Effective supervision relies on strong communication. Educators will:

- Inform colleagues when moving between learning environments.
- Communicate changes in children's locations or supervision responsibilities.
- Share information about children requiring additional supervision.
- Support one another to ensure no area is left unsupervised.
- Maintain awareness of educator positioning throughout the day.

Supporting Children's Independence

While maintaining children's safety, educators will:

- Encourage children to assess and manage appropriate risks.
- Support children to make safe choices.
- Foster independence through age-appropriate experiences.
- Balance children's freedom to explore with effective supervision.
- Recognise that positive risk-taking supports learning, resilience and confidence when appropriately supervised.

ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES

Approved Providers

Will:

- Ensure appropriate systems and resources support effective supervision.
- Maintain compliance with legislative requirements.
- Provide professional learning relating to supervision and child safety.

Centre Director

Will:

- Monitor supervision practices across the service.
 - Ensure supervision arrangements reflect children's needs and the learning environment.
 - Support educators to identify and manage risks.
 - Review incidents to strengthen supervision practices.
 - Promote a culture where child safety is everyone's responsibility.
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Educational Leader

Will:

- Support educators to reflect on supervision practices.
 - Encourage intentional educator positioning within learning environments.
 - Promote supervision strategies that support both safety and learning.
 - Mentor educators in recognising and responding to emerging risks.
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Educators

Will:

- Maintain active supervision at all times.
 - Position themselves effectively throughout the learning environment.
 - Conduct ongoing risk assessments.
 - Communicate clearly with colleagues regarding supervision responsibilities.
 - Respond immediately to safety concerns.
 - Support children's independence while ensuring their safety and wellbeing.
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Students, Volunteers and Relief Educators

Will:

- Work under the guidance and direction of qualified educators.
 - Follow all supervision procedures and instructions.
 - Never be left solely responsible for supervising children.
 - Report hazards or concerns immediately.
 - Contribute to maintaining safe learning environments.
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KIDS ON GALLAGHERS IN PRACTICE

At Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre, supervision is an intentional and dynamic practice that supports both children's safety and their learning. Educators are actively engaged with children throughout the day, positioning themselves to observe play, anticipate potential risks and respond promptly to children's needs.

Supervision strategies are regularly discussed during team meetings and adjusted to reflect children's ages, abilities, interests and the changing learning environment. During transitions, meal times, outdoor play and group experiences, educators communicate closely to ensure every child remains accounted for and appropriately supported.

We believe effective supervision is not about restricting children's exploration, it is about creating environments where children can confidently investigate, take appropriate risks and develop independence while knowing trusted adults are nearby to support and protect them.

CHILDREN'S VOICE IN ACTION

Children are encouraged to contribute to creating safe learning environments by participating in conversations about safety, caring for resources and recognising potential hazards.

Educators listen to children's ideas about managing risks during play and support them to develop confidence in making safe decisions. By involving children in age-appropriate discussions about safety, we strengthen their sense of responsibility, agency and wellbeing.

EXCEEDING PRACTICE

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre recognises that effective supervision extends beyond meeting educator-to-child ratios. It requires intentional planning, continuous observation, teamwork and reflective practice.

Educators regularly evaluate supervision strategies, analyse learning environments and reflect on incidents and near misses to identify opportunities for improvement. Our approach balances children's right to explore, investigate and take appropriate risks with our commitment to providing safe, responsive and well-supervised learning environments.

Through ongoing professional learning, collaborative reflection and strong leadership, supervision practices continue to evolve to meet the changing needs of children, families and the service.

CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre is committed to continuously strengthening supervision practices to ensure children's safety, wellbeing and learning remain at the centre of our daily practice.

This policy will be reviewed through:

- Feedback from children, families and educators.
- Supervision observations and audits.
- Incident and near-miss reviews.
- Staff and leadership meetings.
- Critical reflection.
- Quality Improvement Plan goals.
- Changes to legislation or best practice guidance.
- Assessment and Rating outcomes.

Continuous improvement ensures our supervision practices remain proactive, responsive and reflective of current best practice.

EVIDENCE OF PRACTICE

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre demonstrates this policy through:

- Regular environmental safety checks.
- Head counts completed during transitions, excursions and routine changes.
- Effective communication between educators regarding supervision responsibilities.
- Ongoing professional learning in supervision and risk management.
- Critical reflection following incidents, near misses or identified hazards.
- Quality Improvement Plan goals focused on children's safety and wellbeing.

REFLECTION & CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT

Critical reflection supports our commitment to maintaining safe, responsive and effective supervision practices.

Reflective questions include:

- How effectively do our supervision strategies protect children while supporting their learning and independence?
- Are educators positioned to actively supervise all areas of the environment?
- How do we identify and respond to changing risks throughout the day?
- Do our indoor and outdoor environments support effective supervision?
- How do we communicate supervision responsibilities during transitions and staff changes?
- What have we learnt from incidents, near misses or family feedback?
- What improvements can we make to further strengthen supervision across the service?

Outcomes from these reflections inform policy reviews, professional learning, environmental planning and our Quality Improvement Plan.
