OUR COMMITMENT

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre is committed to providing a safe, healthy and supportive environment that promotes the wellbeing of children, educators, families, volunteers and visitors.

The service maintains a smoke-free, vape-free, alcohol-free and drug-free environment to protect children from exposure to harmful substances and to ensure all adults attending the service are able to carry out their responsibilities safely, professionally and in the best interests of children.

We recognise that children learn through observation and role modelling. By maintaining healthy practices, we provide positive examples that support children's understanding of healthy lifestyles and wellbeing.

LEGISLATIVE INTENT

This policy supports Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre in meeting its obligations under the Education and Care Services National Law and National Regulations by promoting a healthy environment that protects children from exposure to tobacco, vaping products, alcohol and other drugs.

The policy establishes clear expectations for all adults attending the service and supports a workplace that prioritises children's safety, wellbeing and professional conduct.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to:

- Maintain a smoke-free, vape-free, alcohol-free and drug-free education and care environment.
- Protect children from exposure to tobacco smoke, vapour and harmful substances.
- Promote positive health and wellbeing for all members of the service community.
- Ensure educators remain fit for duty while working with children.
- Establish clear expectations for staff, families, volunteers, contractors and visitors.
- Support compliance with legislative and workplace health and safety requirements.

DEFINITIONS

Tobacco Products

Any product containing tobacco, including cigarettes, cigars and loose tobacco.

Electronic Cigarettes (Vapes)

Electronic devices used to inhale vapour containing nicotine or other substances.

Alcohol

Any beverage containing alcohol.

Other Drugs

Prescription medication used inappropriately, illegal substances and any other substance that may impair a person's ability to safely perform their duties or supervise children.

Fit for Duty

Being physically, mentally and emotionally capable of performing work safely without impairment caused by alcohol, drugs or other substances.

WHY THIS POLICY MATTERS

Children have the right to grow, learn and play in environments that promote their health, safety and wellbeing.

Exposure to tobacco smoke, vaping products, alcohol or drug impairment places children at unnecessary risk and is inconsistent with providing high-quality education and care.

By maintaining a smoke-free, vape-free, alcohol-free and drug-free environment, Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre promotes healthy role modelling, supports workplace safety and ensures educators are always able to provide appropriate supervision, care and professional judgement.

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre is committed to:

- Maintaining a smoke-free, vape-free, alcohol-free and drug-free environment at all times.
- Protecting children from exposure to tobacco smoke, vapour and harmful substances.
- Promoting healthy lifestyles through positive role modelling.
- Ensuring all educators and staff are fit for duty while caring for children.
- Complying with all workplace health and safety and legislative requirements.
- Supporting respectful communication and professional conduct when addressing concerns relating to tobacco, alcohol or other drugs.
- Providing clear expectations for educators, families, visitors, volunteers and contractors.
- Continuously reviewing practices to promote a safe and healthy service environment.

OUR POLICY

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre maintains a smoke-free, vape-free, alcohol-free and drug-free environment to ensure the health, safety and wellbeing of all children, educators and visitors.

The service will:

- Prohibit smoking and the use of electronic cigarettes (vapes) anywhere within the service premises, including buildings, outdoor learning environments, entrances, exits, car parks and service vehicles (where applicable).
- Prohibit the consumption or possession of alcohol while children are attending the service or during any service activity.
- Require all educators, volunteers, students and contractors to be fit for duty at all times.
- Prohibit any person from attending the service while affected by alcohol or illegal drugs.
- Require prescription medication that may impair a person's ability to perform their duties safely to be disclosed to the Centre Director where appropriate.
- Ensure concerns relating to impairment are managed respectfully, confidentially and in accordance with employment obligations.
- Promote healthy role modelling for children through professional behaviour and healthy lifestyle practices.

Any person who does not comply with this policy may be requested to leave the service and further action may be taken where appropriate.

HOW WE PUT THIS POLICY INTO PRACTICE

Smoke-Free and Vape-Free Environment

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre will:

- Maintain a completely smoke-free and vape-free environment.
 - Display appropriate signage where required.
 - Ensure educators, families and visitors understand the service's expectations.
 - Ensure no child is exposed to tobacco smoke or vapour while participating in the education and care program.
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Alcohol-Free Environment

The service will:

- Prohibit alcohol from being consumed or stored during operating hours.
 - Ensure no educator, volunteer, contractor or visitor consumes alcohol while supervising or interacting with children.
 - Ensure any service functions involving alcohol occur only outside children's attendance hours and are approved by the Approved Provider where appropriate.
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Other Drugs

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre will:

- Prohibit the possession or use of illegal drugs on the service premises.
 - Require educators to present fit for duty at the commencement of every shift.
 - Respond appropriately where concerns arise regarding impairment.
 - Support workplace health and safety procedures where impairment may affect children's safety.
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Prescription Medication

Where an educator is prescribed medication that may affect their ability to perform their duties safely, they are expected to:

- Inform the Centre Director where the medication may impair judgement, alertness or safe supervision.
- Follow medical advice regarding the safe use of the medication.
- Work collaboratively with leadership to ensure children's safety is maintained.

Any information disclosed will be managed confidentially and in accordance with privacy legislation.

Visitors, Families and Contractors

The service will:

- Inform visitors and contractors of the service's smoke-free, vape-free, alcohol-free and drug-free expectations.
 - Request any person who appears to be affected by alcohol or other drugs to leave the premises if children's safety may be compromised.
 - Maintain professional and respectful communication when managing concerns.
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Health Promotion

Educators will:

- Model healthy lifestyle choices.
 - Promote children's understanding of health and wellbeing through the educational program.
 - Encourage respectful conversations about healthy choices in age-appropriate ways.
 - Maintain professional conduct that reflects the service's values and philosophy.
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ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES

Approved Providers

Will:

- Ensure the service maintains a smoke-free, vape-free, alcohol-free and drug-free environment.
 - Support compliance with legislative and workplace health and safety requirements.
 - Provide appropriate policies and procedures.
 - Support the Centre Director in implementing this policy.
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Centre Director

Will:

- Lead implementation of this policy.
 - Address concerns relating to tobacco, alcohol or other drugs promptly and professionally.
 - Maintain confidentiality where personal information is disclosed.
 - Support educators to remain fit for duty.
 - Ensure appropriate signage and communication are maintained.
 - Monitor compliance with this policy.
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Educational Leader

Will:

- Promote healthy role modelling within the educational program.
 - Support educators to incorporate health and wellbeing into children's learning.
 - Encourage reflective practice relating to healthy environments.
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Educators

Will:

- Arrive at work fit for duty.
 - Comply with the smoke-free, vape-free, alcohol-free and drug-free expectations.
 - Report concerns that may affect children's health or safety.
 - Model healthy behaviours for children.
 - Follow workplace health and safety procedures.
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Students and Volunteers

Will:

- Comply with all requirements of this policy.
 - Present fit for duty.
 - Follow the direction of educators and the Centre Director.
 - Maintain professional conduct while attending the service.
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Families and Visitors

Will:

- Respect the service's smoke-free, vape-free, alcohol-free and drug-free environment.
- Refrain from smoking or vaping anywhere on the service premises.
- Ensure they do not attend the service while affected by alcohol or other drugs where children's safety may be impacted.
- Follow directions provided by educators or the Centre Director regarding this policy.

KIDS ON GALLAGHERS IN PRACTICE

At Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre, we are committed to creating a healthy environment where children can learn and thrive free from exposure to tobacco smoke, vapour, alcohol and other harmful substances.

Our smoke-free, vape-free, alcohol-free and drug-free expectations apply to all educators, families, students, volunteers, contractors and visitors while attending the service or participating in service activities. These expectations are communicated during staff induction, family enrolment and visitor sign-in processes.

Educators model healthy lifestyle choices through their professional conduct and promote children's understanding of health, safety and wellbeing through age-appropriate learning experiences. Any concerns regarding impairment or non-compliance with this policy are managed promptly, respectfully and confidentially, with children's safety remaining the highest priority.

The Centre Director regularly reviews workplace practices to ensure the service continues to provide a safe, healthy and supportive environment for everyone.

CHILDREN'S VOICE IN ACTION

Children are supported to develop an understanding of healthy lifestyles and personal wellbeing through everyday experiences.

Children's voices are encouraged when they:

- Participate in discussions about healthy bodies and healthy choices.
- Learn about caring for themselves and others.
- Explore healthy eating, physical activity and wellbeing through the educational program.
- Ask questions about health and safety in age-appropriate ways.
- Develop confidence to identify trusted adults who help keep them safe.
- Share ideas about creating healthy learning environments.

Educators intentionally promote children's understanding of health and wellbeing through play, conversations, stories and daily routines.

EXCEEDING PRACTICE

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre exceeds the National Quality Standard by fostering a culture where healthy lifestyles, workplace wellbeing and positive role modelling are embedded into everyday practice.

Rather than focusing solely on compliance, educators intentionally model respectful, healthy behaviours that contribute to children's understanding of wellbeing and personal responsibility. The service promotes educator wellbeing through supportive leadership, professional expectations and open communication regarding workplace health and safety.

Healthy environments are viewed as a shared responsibility, with educators, families and visitors working together to maintain a service where children's health, safety and wellbeing are consistently prioritised.

CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT

Kids on Gallaghers Child Care Centre is committed to continually strengthening healthy workplace practices.

This policy will be reviewed through:

- Workplace health and safety reviews.
- Staff consultation and feedback.
- Family feedback where appropriate.
- Review of incidents or concerns relating to tobacco, alcohol or other drugs.
- Professional learning.
- Quality Improvement Plan goals.
- Changes to legislation and recognised best practice.

Continuous improvement ensures our service continues to provide a safe, healthy and supportive environment for all members of our community.

- Do our workplace practices promote educator wellbeing and professional responsibility?
- Are any improvements needed to strengthen communication or signage?
- How do we respectfully manage concerns while maintaining children's safety?
- What additional strategies could further promote healthy environments across the service?

Outcomes from these reflections inform policy review, staff professional learning, workplace health initiatives and our Quality Improvement Plan.
